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### **Being Intentional**

**Coach Belden led the first community chapel of the year on January 25**. First, the chapel opened with a prayer for Kevin Hunter, our beloved cook, for his heart surgery. All teachers laid hands on him and John Laing prayed over him. Then, we had worship and afterwards Coach Belden entered the stage. He invited all the basketball teams up on stage with him to congratulate them. He especially thanked Coach Ross, the girls coach, Mrs. Sedota, the sports manager, Brianna Bowden and Jackson Wall, the team managers, and Trebor, the motivator for

the teams. He let everyone but his "volentolds" Brianna Bowden, and the JV boys team, exit the stage. Coach B proceeded to talk about New Year's resolutions. His first resolution was to not eat so many Doritos, his second was to grow his hair out but the kids in the audience said no to that, his final resolution was to be intentional in everything he did. His five levels of intention were: "Do, Say, Think, Believe, and Feel." He asked the audience why we do what we do and the answer was because it's important to us. He asked everyone to give a thumbs up if they believe God was intentional in what he did. The whole chapel gave a big thumbs up. He asked Thomas Qualls, one of the JV boys players, to read Genesis 1:26-2:3 which says: "Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock

and all the wild animals, and over all the creatures that move along the ground. So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky and over every living creature that moves on the ground." Then God said, "I give you every seed-bearing plant on the face of the whole earth and every tree that has fruit with seed in it. They will be yours for food. And to all the beasts of the earth and



all the birds in the sky and all the creatures that move along the ground—everything that has the breath of life in it—I give every green plant for food." And it was so.God saw all that he had made, and it was very good. And there was evening, and there was morning—the sixth day.Thus the heavens and the earth were completed in all their vast array. He told everyone to think about what we say before we say it. He invited everyone to stand up and be a part of the team. He explained how after every practice, they pray, and then Zach said the prayer. On the count of three, everyone yelled out: "Together!" Mr. Bowman closed the chapel. He said that today is a gift, and then he prayed over everyone. He told everyone to repent if there was something they did that was bothering them. He also gave everyone a chance to invite God into their hearts, or to reconnect with Him.

### Walk in Forgiveness

As the worship team exited the stage, Jon Laing asked them to do something different. He asked them to play in the background while we pray over each other and the school. Before starting his sermon, he gave an emotional prayer.

"Today, we won't talk about forgiveness, but more so *unforgiveness*." Jon Laing started.

He continued by telling the story of Joseph and how he was sold into slavery by his own family. Even so, Joseph forgave. He told a story in Acts 7:57. In this verse, Stephen is speaking about the history of what God does to people who don't want to hear it. Even with stones flying at him, he still forgave them. He then talked about Acts 9, in which Saul encounters the Lord and changes his life.

"Forgiveness is woven throughout the Bible." Jon Laing continued. "If I choose not to forgive, it allows Satan to work in my life and others."

He then provided an example on those very



words. He walked over to a chair with a bag, and pulled out two stuffed animals; Cletus and Billy Ray Cyrus. They were having a birthday lunch of grilled cheese and tater tots. Once Billy Ray walked away to talk to someone, Cletus ate his lunch. Billy Ray then asked who ate his lunch. Billy Ray had a decision: to forgive him, or walk in unforgiveness. Billy Ray chose not to forgive, and picked up the big ol' bag of unforgiveness. Inside this bag, John placed weights labeled with things brought by unforgiveness. The first one was anger. Billy Ray was mad. The second one was unholy thoughts. Billy Ray was thinking negatively about him. The third one was gossip. Billy Ray went and told everyone what he did. The fourth one was bitterness. This event changed how he acts. The fifth one was anxiety. He couldn't eat or sleep right anymore. The sixth one was depression. He was mentally broken because he didn't forgive. The seventh one is doubting God. The eighth one is questioning God. Billy Ray questioned God's entire existence. The bag became very heavy. If he forgave, he wouldn't carry that bag around with him.

Jon then talked about Jesus speaking forgiveness over everyone as He's crucified.

"How can we not forgive when He did that?!"

He made the boys stand up, and told them to never forget this:

"One day, it'll be up to you to lead your family towards Jesus or not. If you don't walk in forgiveness, it will affect your kids and wives lives."

He made the girls stand up, and told them to never forget this: "Forgive!"

He told us to leave the weight bag of unforgiveness behind, and left us with a verse. Psalm 37:3; "Trust in the Lord and do good...do the next right thing." He ended in prayer.

Mr. Bowman came onto the stage to dismiss the students. He told us that we have no idea what a privilege it is to listen, pray, and worship freely, and that our life is an act of worship.


