Open up the gates and let heaven on in." After a quick prayer the middle schoolers exit the stage as Mr.Bowman enters. He greets the audience and we give another round of applause for the students. After that Jon Laing enters the stage with enthusiastic greetings. He introduced himself then asked for all of our names. After the audience velled out their names he says, "I know all of your names by heart now!"-getting a laugh out of the audience. He then thanked the GCA staff for all they do. Even calling Mr.Bowman the best principal he has ever met.

He began getting into his speech,

starting with one of his biggest fears. Killer whales. He spoke of a time he went to Sea World saying it was the most terrifying place on earth. Then about the 1993 classic, *Free Willy,* describing that as the scariest movie in the world. He spoke of the



main character, Jesse. "He made bad choices, got put into foster care, went through a few families, people didn't get him so he became besties with a killer whale." He exaggerated the story a bit and spoke of the plot saying how he was terrified when Willy made the big jump over Jesse. "Let me just say, when life gives you lemons, don't go jump on the back of a killer whale!" After speaking about the movie for a bit longer everything got very serious with one word. "Fear."

each other, and I pray that will take place here. I pray that revival starts today. Thank you for the opportunity to just speak here, Lord. For the middle schoolers worshiping. May we never take that for granted. Thank you for staying in my heart.

Mr. Bowman comes back onto the stage and tells us, everyday is a new day. Take his challenge right now and answer that question everyday. When we do that, God takes over. The impact isn't in this building. It's in this community. Let's go chase after God. I appreciate you. Have a great day.

GCA Skate Night




