Moses then asked God what to do. The Lord said to him to walk out in front of the people and strike the rock on which you stand. Once he struck the rock, water gushed out. Moses made it a memorial and named it not for God being faithful and working miracles, but for their *lack of faith* in God. She said that the strongest message of that story was that they *did not* trust God. They *did not* have faith. They *did not* follow what God said. Even though they disobeyed Him, God is always faithful, He is always with us, and he is the rock on which we stand.

Mrs. Alison asked if we woke up this morning and complained about something. We didn't trust God. She asked if from now on we will trust God. The students responded with a roaring "YES!" She finished off with saying that we should want the presence of God more than anything. She prayed, and just before exiting the stage, Mr. Bowman asks her to move to the center of the floor. He wanted some of the students to pray over her, because she worked 18 years at TLC, and her impact on the community could never be measured. The


#### On October 10, 2023, the middle school played against The Burlington School again.
